**Protecting Student Privacy from Military Recruitment
It's the Law**

Sponsored by CAMS and UTLA Human Rights Committee

Obtain and return the Opt Out Form (Information Release) by October 24th, 2008.
This form must be signed by a parent for 17 year old students.

FACTS:

- * Section 9528 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 2001 (also known as "No Child Left Behind") mandates that school districts must provide the contact information (names, addresses and telephone numbers) of secondary school students (juniors and seniors) to the military, upon request.
- * Students and their parents have the right to opt out of the information being released, and it is the district's legal obligation to inform them of that right.

Operation Opt Out Campaign

*Teachers, students, parents and community members pass out the Opt Out forms at the high schools. The forms can be passed out in front of the school, during homeroom, at parent meetings, by students through campus clubs, or handed out during the school day.
