HU-MON-GOUS: gigantic, very huge

PO-VER-TY: being poor

VUL-NER-A-BLE: able to be hurt or wounded or injured

AD-VER-SAR-Y: the enemy or opponent

WAGE: money earned from work

CU-MU-LA-TIVE: increasing one by one by addition

MON-E-TAR-Y: relating to money

RE-FORM: to make better by getting rid of problems

DE-CLINE: to decrease and lose strength, to refuse an offer

IN-SUR-ANCE: paying something to protect yourself or property so that if it gets destroyed it will be replaced

IN-AD-E-QUATE: not enough; not able; not done well

BUDG-ET: a plan of income and spending; money comes in from work or sales and money goes out to pay bills

PRE-NA-TAL: occurring or happening before giving birth

DE-FI-CIT: the amount of money still owed after all the money has been spent, overspending

SPEC-U-LATE: to buy and sell stocks in a company to make a profit; also, to form an opinion without evidence

BLOAT-ED: swollen with self-importance; too fat from eating rich foods

CON-TAM-I-NA-TION: when something has been polluted or poisoned

VERGE: the extreme edge or the brink of something; right before something changes
